 - During activities, ask students to refer to other field studies. For example, you might say, "Do you guys remember on soil when you talked about how soil moves?" when discussing erosion of cut banks.
 - Challenge your kids. They'll think of connections on their own, and you just have to get them to say them.
 - When looking at an area, ask, "What would this look like if there wasn't any soil?" or something like that.
 - The point is to get them thinking. Your work is to stimulate their brains!
